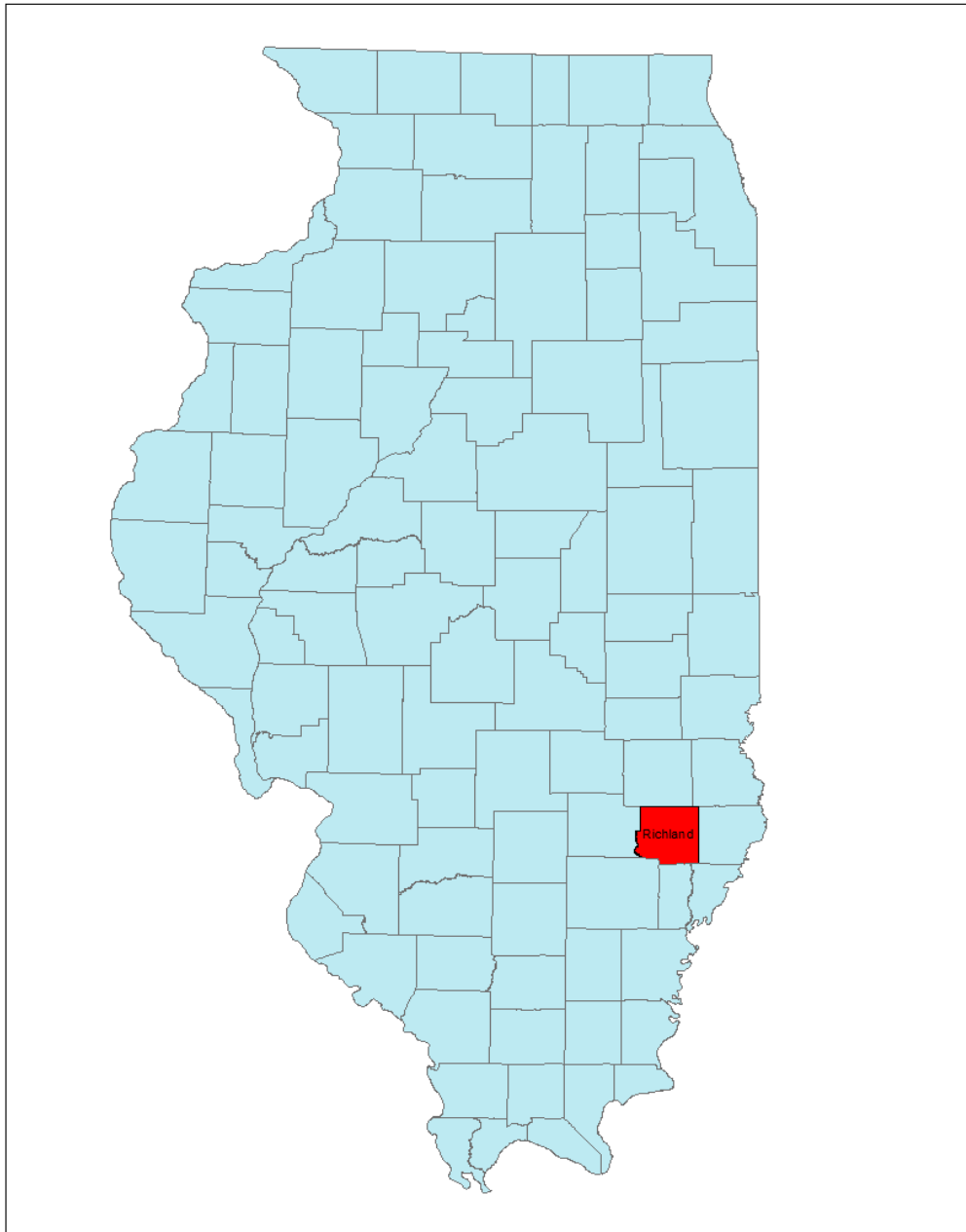

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**PURPOSE OF AGENCY:** To provide home health services.

**COUNTIES SERVED:** Richland, Jasper, Edwards, Clay, White, Wabash, Wayne, Crawford, and Lawrence.

**ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:** Those experiencing health problems are eligible. Medicare will reimburse if patient is Medicare eligible and the patient needs considerable assistance to leave their home, does not drive, and leaves the home for short infrequent trips such as physician visits, hair care, or church services. The patient must be in need of intermittent nursing care--usually two hours or less a day.

Medicaid patients also should be homebound except for short outings--most all Medicare laws also apply to these clients.

Insurance and private pay usually have no such restrictions.

**SERVICES PROVIDED:** Skilled nursing services are provided. Those services include I.V. therapy, wound care, diabetic care, injections, drawing of blood for lab work, care of central venous lines, PICC lines, and teaching and training to patients and families. Home Health, Physical Therapy, Speech Pathology, and Occupational Therapy are other services provided in the home. A Licensed Clinical Social Worker is available for assistance with advance directives or socio-economic problems.

**TARGET POPULATION:** We serve all ages, although most clients are elderly.

**COST TO CLIENTS:** There is no cost to Medicare and Medicaid eligible patients. Private pay patients may pay on a payment plan. Insurance patients are billed for co-payment. VA patients are accepted.

**OTHER COMMENTS:** We are licensed by the State of Illinois, Medicare, and Medicaid. We are an active member of the Illinois Home Care Council. All patients must be under the care of a physician. Anyone can refer a patient; many of our referrals are made by patients, families of patients, or friends.

**PURPOSE OF AGENCY:** The purpose of Big Brothers/Big Sisters of Richland County is to mentor at-risk children by matching them with caring adults.

In the Pre-School, learning the alphabet and numbers and other basics is offered along with a religious foundation; four-year olds meet three mornings each week, while the three-year olds meet two mornings. Mom's Morning Out is on Wednesday mornings and emphasizes play, craft projects, cooperation, and a primary introduction to faith. All sessions are from 8:30 to 11:30 a.m.
